Hello Collectors

Welcome to a new edition of the Stamp Bulletin, presenting upcoming Australian stamp issues and themed collectables, including the stamps that we plan to release to celebrate Australia's participation in the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games, postponed last year due to Covid-19 but which are now expected to take place from 23 July to 8 August 2021.

The stamp issue Ticket to Tokyo marks the lead up to the Games, where around 12,000 athletes are expected to participate in just under 340 events in more than 30 sports. During the Games, Australia Post will mark a Gold Medal win by Australian athletes with the release of a sheetlet of 10 stamps within 72 hours of a gold medal presentation (see page 6 for details).

Australian Contemporary Sculpture showcases four smallscale sculptures made in Australia in the last six decades by renowned and skilful artists. Norfolk Island Museum: Maritime Models presents hand-crafted model ships from the museum's collections. The vessels, the HMS *Sirius* and the HMAT *Supply*, are linked with the British settlement of both Australia's east coast and Norfolk Island in 1788.

There are three new stamp releases that highlight both the adaptability and fragility of nature. Australia's Volcanic Past features three extinct volcanoes: two on the Australian mainland and one now comprising Lord Howe Island. Australian Native Bonsai presents three Australian native tree species as bonsai, an ancient art and science with Chinese and Japanese origins. Christmas Island Turtles highlights two endangered species: the Hawksbill Turtle, which feeds around the island, and the Green Turtle, the only turtle species that nests on the island.

We are busily preparing for Stamp Collecting Month in August, which celebrates the popular pastime of stamp collecting, particularly with children in mind. This year's theme focuses on STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Maths), an important part of the school curriculum. Full of colour and fun, the illustrations bring to life virtual reality, hydroponics, space study, robotics and urban design.







While the Covid-19 pandemic has delayed the Tokyo Olympics by 12 months, the event is still known as Tokyo 2020. It will be an Olympics like no other, with the challenges of risk-management during a global pandemic radically reshaping the event.

On 23 July, Tokyo's new National Stadium will come to life, as the Olympic torch ignites the Olympic cauldron during the Opening Ceremony and the Games are declared open. Between 23 July and 8 August, the competitive spirit of elite athletes will be on show at venues in and around Japan's vibrant capital city. This will be the second

time Tokyo has hosted the Summer Olympics, having previously welcomed Olympians and spectators from around the world in 1964.

The Games' program features 339 events, in 33 sports incorporating 50 disciplines. Approximately 12,000 athletes will compete, with the Australian team comprising around 470 of our most outstanding sportspeople. Men's baseball and women's softball will make a return to the Summer Olympic program, and for these Games surfing, skateboarding, karate and sport climbing will expand the core events.

Australian Gold Medallist Instant Sheetlets

Each Australian gold medal performance in Tokyo will be celebrated with a gold medallist sheetlet.

Australia Post will produce a sheetlet of gold mediallist stamps within 72 hours of the medal ceremony taking place.*

How to purchase

Gold medallist sheetlets will be available through participating Australian Post Offices, the Australian Philatelic Bureau and online shortly after the gold medal ceremony in Tokyo.*

Customers with standing orders

The gold medallist instant sheetlets are not included with any Philatelic Bureau standing order. If you have a standing order you will need to request your gold medallist sheetlets separately from the Philatelic Bureau.

* Availability will depend on the gold medal ceremony timing.

Postmarking conditions

Collectors can make their own covers using the official blank cover available or their own envelopes. Olympic copyright and trademark restrictions apply to all private covers and the following conditions apply for Tokyo 2020 Australian gold medallist stamps and covers.

- The first day of issue is the date the stamp is available in the outlet.
- Australia Post participating Post Offices and the Australian Philatelic Bureau will be permitted to apply FDI postmarks to gold medallist covers for a period of one month from the date that a gold medallist stamp was issued (available for sale from that location).

Australian gold medallist postmarking

The Australia Post retail outlets listed on the right will have local FDI postmarks for the Australian gold medallist stamps. Each of these postmarks has its own location and postcode featured, as well as a movable date.

After the Games, a set of 14 FDCs with FDI postmarks (one for each postcode listed right) for each gold medallist stamp will be available by mail order through the Australian Philatelic Bureau and online. Individual FDCs will not be available by this means; requests for individual postmarking should be directed to the specific Post Office.

Requests for individual gold medallist postmarking should be directed to the relevant outlet.

Ordering postmarking impressions by mail

Collectors need to specify which postmark they would like applied to their cover.

- Standard FDI postmark available from any participating Post Office with a standard FDI postmark
- Every day (normal counter date stamp) available from any participating Post Office
- Australian gold medallist postmark available from locations listed on the right, or as a full set for each of the Australian gold medallists after the Games.



German-born Inge King AM (1915–2016) worked in wood and stone before moving to steel and aluminum in 1959. Known for her monumental, abstract public sculptures, she also exhibited smaller works such as *Planet*, composed of shimmering stainless steel. In the 1950s Lenton Parr AM (1924–2003) worked as assistant to renowned English sculptor Henry Moore. On his return to Australia in 1957, he began to specialise in enamelled steel sculptures such as *Rigel*. Yvonne Koolmatrie (b. 1944) is from Ngarrindjeri country of the lower

Murray River and the Coorong of South Australia. She was first instructed in traditional coiled bundle weaving techniques using riverland sedge rushes by elder Dorothy Kartinyeri. Koolmatrie's wide-ranging subjects include animals, the human figure, planes and hot-air balloons, as well as traditional objects such as *Eel trap*. Lex Namponan (b. 1971) and others from the Aurukun, Queensland, Apalech clan have become famous for their idiosyncratic milkwood sculptures of camp dogs. The dog, or Ku, like *Smiley Blue Eye*, is a sacred totem for the clan.

Although there are no active volcanoes on the Australian continent, over the last 40 million years much of eastern Australia has been subject to episodic volcanic activity, the most recent being around 5,000 years ago at Mount Gambier, South Australia. This issue features three extinct volcanoes on the Australian mainland and one now comprising an offshore island.

Wollumbin Mount Warning, in the Tweed River Valley of New South Wales, is the remnant plug of the central vent of a huge shield volcano that last erupted some 23 million years ago. It is estimated that the cone of this now-extinct volcano was 2,000 metres high, with a diameter of 100 kilometres. Erosion has since reduced the mountain to around half the original height.

Table Cape, near Wynyard in north-western Tasmania dramatically rises 170 metres from the sea. This basalt landform is a remnant plug of an extinct volcano that last erupted around 12 million years ago. The flattened top was formed from a hardened lake of lava.





Technically, an Australia Post maximum card is comprised of three matching components:

- a postcard
- a stamp with the same subject matter as the postcard, attached to the picture side and not the address side
- a postmark tying the stamp to the card that is relevant to the theme.

The fertile open, grassy plains of Victoria's Western District is home to around 400 extinct and dormant volcanoes, stony rises, volcanic lakes and other features and is the third most extensive volcanic plain in the world. It is thought that most eruptions took place between 4.5 million and 5,000 years ago. Mount Elephant lies near the town of Derrinallum. It is a steep-sided, small volcano with a breached crater that rises 240 metres above the surrounding plain. One of many scoria cones in the Western District, it last erupted between 5,000 and 20,000 years ago.

Lord Howe Island, which lies in the Tasman Sea east of Port Macquarie in New South Wales, is the remnant of an extinct shield volcano that last erupted about seven million years ago. Originally 30 kilometres in diameter, the crescent-shaped island is now much reduced to just 14.55 square kilometres and dominated by two basalt peaks, the remains of lava flows that once filled a large volcanic caldera. The world's largest volcanic stack, Ball's Pyramid, lies 20 kilometres southeast of the island.

Norfolk Island Museum Maritime Models



Norfolk Island's history is preserved and recounted through the Norfolk Island Museum, its four exhibition sites being part of the Kingston and Arthur's Vale Heritage Area. The stamps depict two hand-crafted model ships displayed at the HMS Sirius Museum site. The vessels are linked with British settlement of both Australia's east coast and Norfolk Island in 1788.

On 6 March 1790, HMS *Sirius* and HMAT *Supply* sailed to Norfolk Island with marines, convicts and stores. Due to strong southerlies and high seas in Norfolk's Sydney Bay, the ships dropped convicts and marines at the more sheltered Cascade Bay on 13 March. They waited six days before entering Sydney Bay. On entering the bay, the storm worsened and the wind direction changed, eventually wrecking the drifting *Sirius* on the reef.







The translation of the Japanese term *bonsai* is "planted in a container". The bonsai artist uses various tools to sculpt a living tree in a way that produces a miniature version of a full-size tree growing in the wild, typically to between 15 and 90 centimetres high. This is achieved through regular pruning of the branches and foliage. Sometimes the trees are shaped using wire (a temporary measure that 'trains' the trunk or branches into a particular shape). There are various presentation styles. The Australian native trees featured in this

issue (a bottlebrush, fig and paperbark) are, or have been, housed at the National Bonsai and Penjing Collection of Australia, which is part of the National Arboretum, Canberra.

Bonsai has been practised in Japan for at least 1,200 years. It originated from the even older Chinese practice of penjing, which is the art of and science of growing miniature landscapes in a pot or tray (as opposed to a single, more sparsely presented tree).

Bonsai's genesis in Asian cultures is evident by the influence of Zen, Taoism and Confucianism on its practice, including the concepts of immortality and longevity, minimalist aesthetics, finding beauty in austerity, perfection through endeavour,

Knowledge of miniature trees spread to Western cultures in the 1800s, including to Australia, when penjing specimens were brought here by Chinese migrants. Post–World War II, soldiers brought

respect for ritual and reverence for old age.

home the practice of bonsai, leading it to become widely known in the Western world, including in Australia. From the late 1960s, the practice of bonsai gained wide popularity and, in Australia, led to the establishment of the Association of Australian Bonsai Clubs in 1980, which currently represents 58 bonsai clubs across the country. In 2022, Australia is set to host the ninth World Bonsai Convention, in Perth.

It's full STEAM ahead with this year's stamp collecting month! STEAM stands for science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics, subject areas that develop skills necessary for the challenges of the 21st century. As our world becomes more focused on technology, competency in these disciplines is critical for our future. The minisheet and five stamps in this issue focus on elements of the STEAM curriculum, including sustainability, biology, robotics and coding, chemistry, physics, astronomy, computer science and the arts. A well-rounded education that includes

arts or humanities subjects develops the critical thinking necessary for evaluating, planning and appreciating the "big picture" of how science and technology will assist us in dealing with modern life.

Virtual reality (VR) is a digital, computer-generated, three-dimensional experiential environment. This technology is increasingly used in Australian schools to heighten student engagement. By using a VR headset with embedded educational resources, students can gain access to enhanced interactions that are not practical or possible in the real world.



Environmental sustainability is perhaps the world's greatest challenge. Hydroponics is a method of growing plants without soil by immersing or suspending the roots in mineral nutrients dissolved in water. This method uses much less water than traditional farming.

The mysteries of the galaxies, nebulae, black holes and stars transfix children. Space science is a perennial favourite with students and, with the recent landing on Mars of the NASA rover Perseverance, also very topical.

A robot is a computer-programmed machine that substitutes or replicates human actions. Robots are increasingly being used to carry out repetitive, routine tasks in industry and delicate operations requiring great precision in medicine and high-risk, dangerous tasks.

The Design and Technologies curriculum asks that students create design solutions across a range of technologies and contexts. Students consider the economic, environmental and social impacts of technology. One such project might involve designing an urban environment.

The only turtle to also nest on Christmas Island is the large, herbivorous Green Turtle (*Chelonia mydas*). Like all sea turtles, it is migratory, often travelling thousands of kilometres between feeding and nesting grounds. On Christmas Island, Green Turtles nest throughout the year on Dolly and Greta beaches, laying clutches of 85 to 200 round white eggs, before covering them with sand and returning to the ocean. Found throughout the world's tropical oceans, the smaller Hawksbill Turtle (*Eretochelys imbricata*) feeds around Christmas Island, using its distinctive curved beak to probe coral reefs for sponges and other soft-bodied animals. Threats to turtles include pollution and habitat destruction, as well as over-harvesting and predation of eggs, as well as current-driven plastic debris.
